**C C Notivation** is defined as the process that initiates, guides and maintains goal-oriented behaviors. Motivation is what causes us to act, whether it is getting a glass of water to reduce thirst or reading a book to gain knowledge."

As students, the desire of learning new knowledge becomes our motivation to read more books.

As library staff and policy -makers, their motivation is to provide convenient opportunities for students to gain knowledge.




At James Lemont Fogg Memorial Library (The library at Art Center), regular circulation books, magazines, and audio books are available for a 3-week checkout with up to 2 renewals and have a .20/day per item late fine. Students can check out a maximum of 25 books. That gives you a lot of flexibility to choose different kind of books and to hold them as references.

It is impossible read all the books in short amount of time, but students can hold them longer by using 2 renews. Students can renew their books easily online, or they can call in. We can even bring books into the library and recheck them out for another 2 renews.


Students can hold their lovely books for a longer periods of time by using this strategy. I am still holding few books from 2 terms ago.






